



NEPC Joins Bluesky



When we shut down our @NEPCtweet account on Twitter 16 months ago, [we explained](#) that the decision was “straightforward but not easy.” We couldn’t abide participation in a platform where “[d]isinformation and conspiracy theories, as well as bigotries of all sorts, . . . moved from tolerated to celebrated.”

We also explained that we wouldn’t move to Threads, a “privacy nightmare” run by Meta. But we would, we said, keep an eye on Mastodon and Bluesky.

We’re now happy to announce that we’re back on social media, @nepc.bsky.social.

Bluesky is growing at an astonishing rate. It had 10.85 million users in mid-October. By mid-November, it had passed 17 million users, emerging as a [clear alternative](#) to Twitter/X. It now has approximately 25 million users. Because Bluesky is unusually transparent, up-to-date statistics on usage are public and summarized by user “Jaz” at <https://bsky.jazco.dev/stats>.

In our first days on the new platform, we’ve found none of the ugliness that had come to plague Twitter—no unpleasant musky smell of trolls. Bluesky also has a “Moderation Lists” feature, whereby users can choose to opt into privately maintained lists of accounts to block (e.g., accounts using Nazi symbols).
